Students will understand how to use the various components of the Comic Life application. Students will understand how to use Google Images to add images to their page.

Essential Questions to guide this unit/lesson and focus teaching and learning:

Can students use the elements of Comic Life to create their page?

Technology & Web 2.0 resources needed (hardware and software, websites)

Mac computer, Comic Life application

Procedure (learning activities)/ lessons of unit

1. Students or teacher creates a desktop folder with individual student photos.
2. Import photos to Comic Life.
3. Students will title their poster with their first name.
4. Students will write complete sentences using ideas from their I Am poem.
5. Students will add graphics/clip art/photos using Google images.

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6. Students will save their completed page (as a JPEG) to a desktop folder.

Assessment Method

Rubric: 4- Advanced: Students had all elements required, followed directions, and were able to assist others.

3 – Proficient: Students had all elements required, followed directions.

2 – Basic: Students lacked one or two elements on their completed page

1 – Below Basic: Students required teacher assistance to complete entire page.
